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PART 1 Conditions of Bid

1. BACKGROUND AND INTRODUCTORY PROVISIONS

Refer to Part 3 of this invitation to bid for background and introductory information relating to the Services and this invitation to bid.

2. OFFER AND SPECIAL CONDITIONS

- 2.1 Without detracting from the generality of clause below, bidders must submit a completed and signed Invitation to Bid form (SBD 1) and requisite bid forms attached as <u>Part 5</u>) with its bid. Bidders must take careful note of the special conditions.
- 2.2 All bids submitted in reply to this invitation to bid should incorporate all the forms, parts, certificates and other documentation forming part of this invitation to bid, duly completed where required.

NB: Suppliers who had contract/s with Frontier Hospital in the past four (4) months will NOT be given preference for this bid.

Suppliers will be NOT be awarded more than two (2) Contracts regardless of points and price quoted.

- 2.3 It is a requirement that original valid Tax Clearance Certificate be submitted with the bid. Failure to submit will invalidate your bid.
- 2.3 In the event that any form or certificate provided in Part 5 of this invitation to bid does not have adequate space for the bidder to provide the requested details, the bidder should attach an annexure to such form or certificate on which the requested details should be provided and the bidder should refer to such annexure in the form or certificate provided.

3. CLOSING TIME OF BIDS AND PROVISIONS RELATING TO SUBMISSION OF BIDS

- 3.1 The closing time for the receipt of bids in response to this invitation to bid is detailed on the cover page of this invitation to bid.
- 3.2 All bids must be submitted in a sealed envelope bearing the bid number, bid description and closing date.
- 3.4 All bids must be received before the closing time and date stipulated above and must be posted to or deposited in the bid box at the address detailed on the cover page of this invitation to bid.

4. ENQUIRIES

Should any bidder have any enquiries relating to this invitation to bid, such inquiries may only be addressed to the person/s detailed on the cover page to this invitation to bid at the number/s stipulated.

5. COMPULSORY BID BRIEFING/ CLARIFICATION

The details of the compulsory briefing session are indicated on the cover page of the bid. Bidders will be required to sign the attendance register at the briefing session. Signature of the attendance

register will constitute proof of compliance with this condition. Bidders who do not attend or sign the register will be disqualified.

6. TAX CLEARANCE

The bidder should submit a tax clearance certificate together with the bid documentation. A pro forma application for Tax Clearance Certificate (SBD 2) is attached as <u>Part 5 – Schedule B.</u> Bidder must take specific note of the conditions stipulated in ECBD 2.

7. PRICING

- 7.1 The bidder must submit details regarding the bid price for the Services on the Pricing Schedule form/s attached as Part 5 Schedule C which completed form/s must be submitted together with the bid documents.
- 7.2 Pricing must be stipulated INCLUSIVE OF VALUE ADDED TAX.
- 7.3 It is an express requirement of this invitation to bid that the bidders provide some transparency in respect to their pricing approach. In this regard, bidders must indicate the basis on which they have calculated their pricing by completing all aspects of the Pricing Schedule form Part 5 Schedule C

8. QUALIFICATIONS OF BIDDERS

Bidders must submit detailed information together with their bid of their experience in the relevant trade together with present contracts. These details should be submitted together with the bid on the form attached as Part 5 – Schedule F.

9. PARTNERSHIPS AND LEGAL ENTITIES

In the case of the bidder being a partnership, close corporation or a company all certificates reflecting the names, identity numbers and address of the partners, members or directors (as the case may be) must be submitted with the bid. These details should be submitted on the form attached as <u>Part 5</u>—Schedule G

10. CONSORTIUM / JOINT VENTURE

- 10.1 It is recognized that bidders may wish to form consortia to provide the Services.
- 10.2 A bid in response to this invitation to bid by a consortium shall comply with the following requirements: -
- 10.3 It shall be signed so as to be legally binding on all consortium members;
- One of the members shall be nominated by the others as authorized to be the lead member and this authorization shall be included in the agreement entered into between the consortium members;
- The lead member shall be the only authorized party to make legal statements, communicate with the DOH and receive instructions for and on behalf of any and all the members of the consortium;
- 10.6 A copy of the agreement entered into by the consortium members shall be submitted with the bid.

10.7 Each party to the Consortium must submit valid Tax Clearance Certificate in the original.

11. VALIDITY

Bid documentation submitted by the bidder will be valid and open for acceptance for a period of **90** (ninety) calendar days from the closing date and time stipulated on the front cover of this invitation to bid.

12. ACCEPTANCE OF BIDS

The State, the Eastern Cape Provincial Government, the DoH (as the case may be) does not bind itself to accept either the lowest or any other bid and reserves the right to accept the bid which it deems to be in the best interest of the State even if it implies a waiver by the State, the Eastern Cape Provincial Government, the Technical Review Committee or the DoH, (as the case may be) of certain requirements which the State, the Eastern Cape Provincial Government, the Technical Review Committee or the DoH, (as the case may be) considers to be of minor importance and not complied with by the bidder.

13. NO RIGHTS OR CLAIMS

- Receipt of the invitation to bid does not confer any right on any party in respect of the Services or in respect of or against the DoH. The DoH (as the case may be) reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to withdraw by notice to bidders any Services or combination of Services from the bid process, to terminate any party's participation in the bid process or to accept or reject any response to this invitation to bid on notice to the bidders without liability to any party. Accordingly, parties have no rights, expressed or implied, with respect to any of the Services as a result of their participation in the bid process.
- 13.2 Neither the DoH, nor any of their respective directors, officers, employees, agents, representatives or advisors will assume any obligations for any costs or expenses incurred by any party in or associated with any appraisal and/or investigation relating to this invitation to bid or the subsequent submission of a bid in response to this invitation to bid in respect of the Services or any other costs, expenses or liabilities of whatsoever nature and howsoever incurred by bidders in connection with or arising out of the bid process.

14. NON DISCLOSURE, CONFIDENTIALITY AND SECURITY

- 14.1 The invitation to bid and its contents are made available on condition that they are used in connection with the bid process set out in the invitation to bid and for no other purpose. All information pertaining to this invitation to bid and its contents shall be regarded as restricted and divulged on a "need to know" bases with the approval of the DoH.
- 14.2 In the event that the bidder is appointed pursuant to this invitation to bid such bidder may be subject to security clearance prior to commencement of the Services.

15. ACCURACY OF INFORMATION

15.1 The information contained in the invitation to bid has been prepared in good faith. Neither the DoH nor any of their respective directors, advisors, officers, employees, agents, representatives make any representation or warranty or give any undertaking express or implied, or accept any responsibility or

liability whatsoever, as to the contents, accuracy or completeness of the information contained in the invitation to bid, or any other written or oral information made available in connection with the bid and nothing contained herein is, or shall be relied upon as a promise or representation, whether as to the past or the future.

This invitation to bid may not contain all the information that may be required to evaluate a possible submission of a response to this invitation to bid. The bidder should conduct its own independent analysis of the operations to the extent required to enable it to respond to this bid.

16. COMPETITION

- Bidders and their respective officers, employees and agents are prohibited from engaging in any collusive action with respect to the biding process which serves to limit competition amongst bidders.
- In general, the attention of bidders is drawn to Section 4(1)(iii) of the Competition Act1998 (Act No. 89 of 1998) (the Competition Act) that prohibits collusive biding.
- 16.3 If bidders have reason to believe that competition issues may arise from any submission of a response to this bid invitation they may make; they are encouraged to discuss their position with the competition authorities before submitting response.
- Any correspondence or process of any kind between bidders and the competition authorities must be documented in the responses to this invitation to bid.

17. RESERVATION OF RIGHTS

- 17.1 Without limitation to any other rights of the DoH (whether otherwise reserved in this invitation to bid or under law), the DoH expressly reserves the right to: -
- 17.2 Request clarification on any aspect of a response to this invitation to bid received from the bidder, such requests and the responses to be in writing;
- 17.3 Amend the bidding process, including the timetables, closing date and any other date at its sole discretion;
- 17.4 Reject all responses submitted by bidders and to embark on a new bid process.
- 17.5 Award the bid to one or more than one bidder/s.

18. EVALUATION CRITERIA

The bid will be evaluated as follows:

Stage 1: Administrative Compliance

Stage 2: Compliance of Non-Negotiables

Stage 3: Price & Specific Goals' Points

 The bid will be evaluated in terms of the 80/20-point system as stipulated in the Revised Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022. 80 points will be allocated for price and 20 points for specific goals

Where

Ps = points scored for comparative price of bid or offer under consideration.

STAGE 1:

PRE - QUALIFICATION / ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLIANCE

1. The purpose of this Prequalification is to determine which bid is compliant and non-compliant with the bid specifications issued by the DOH as part of the bid process.

The following criteria shall apply:

- a. All documentation inclusive of supporting documentation requested in terms of the Bid Document requirements must be submitted and signed off where required.
- b. A valid original South African Revenue Services (SARS) Taxation Clearance Certificate must be submitted with the bid.
- c. A valid copy of CK1 & CK2 documentation if the applicant is a close Corporation and a valid copy of CM1, CM2, CM27 and CM29 documents if the applicant is a company must be submitted.
- d. Bidder must complete and sign SBD4...
- e. Bidders must be a legal entity or partnership (consortia / joint ventures are acceptable subject to Paragraph 12 of Part 1 of the Bid Document).
- f. The quotations must be calculated correctly
- g. The bidder must have attended briefing (in the case where the briefing is compulsory)
- a. The bidder and shareholders must submit certified copies of their Identity Document (ID).
- b. Service Provider must be registered with the Provincial Treasury Supplier Database (E.C.) and furnish the supplier number as well as Logis, CSD supplier number and Bas numbers of the ECDOH. Quotation must include all the cost relating to the service (N.B. no hidden cost will be paid by the Department of Health-Frontier Hospital.
- c. The bidder must be able to supply ALL the items.

PART 2 Conditions of Contract and Operational Requirements

1. CONTRACT

The contract for the supply of the required Service in terms of this invitation to bid shall come into being on the date of issue of the letter of acceptance of the bidders bid by the Eastern Cape Provincial Government, the DoH or any other authorized authority or person (as the case may be) once-off. The bidder is further obliged for the future support while the contract is in force.

2. FEES AND CHARGES

- 2.1 The stipulated bid prices shall be fixed (firm).
- 2.2 Payment of any consideration in terms of the contract shall not constitute acceptance of any defective or non-conforming Services or otherwise relieve Service Provider of any of its obligations under the contract.
- 2.3 To the extent that the DoH disputes the correctness, nature, extent or calculation of any fees or expenses payable to Service Provider in terms of the contract, DoH shall be entitled to withhold payment of such disputed amounts until such time as such dispute is resolved.

3. GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE SERVICE PROVIDER

- 3.1 The DoH's operational requirements. The Service Provider shall, in the provision of the required service, have due regard to the operational requirements of the DoH and other parties occupying or operating from the relevant institution, clinic and Office and shall not do, or permit to be done, anything which may negatively impact on such parties' operational requirements.
- 3.2 Problem identification and reporting. The Service Provider shall be proactive in reporting any matters which it may become aware of which may impact on the business continuity or operations of the DoH at the relevant institution, clinic and office. Without detracting from the generality of this statement, Service Provider shall:-
- Without delay inform the DoH of all incidents or accidents which may occur at the relevant Complex which involve Service Provider's personnel;
- Co-operate fully with the DoH in analyzing and investigating such incidents or accidents.
- 3.3 Other Service Providers The Service Provider acknowledges that it may be required to provide the Services in conjunction with third party service providers and shall, where requested by the DoH, cooperate fully with such persons.
- **3.4** Regulations and statutes The Service Provider shall, in the provision of the Services observe and comply with all relevant provisions of all applicable legislation and regulation

3.5 Compliance with procedures.

It is recorded that during the currency of the contract the DoH may implement procedures and policies at the relevant Institution. The Service Provider shall comply fully with any such reasonable procedures and policies, including the permit to work procedures and health and safety procedures.

- 3.6 The Service Provider shall ensure that it and its personnel shall at all times comply fully with any safety, fire, emergency and security procedures and policies applicable at the relevant Institution.
- 3.7 Should the DoH at any time believe that any member of Service Provider's personnel is failing to comply with any such procedures or policies, the DoH shall be entitled to deny such personnel member access to the relevant premises and require Service Provider to replace such person without delay.
- 3.8 <u>Service Provider's procedures</u> The Service Provider shall, upon receipt of written request from the DoH or its appointed Manager:-
- 3.9 Provide the DoH with copies of all Service Provider's operating procedures and processes relating to the Services; Service Provider must be registered with the Department of Provincial Treasury Supplier Database (E.C.) and furnish both the supplier numbers as well as Logis and Bas system numbers of the ECDOH.
- 3.10 Certified copy of the original and valid **IDENTITY DOCUMENT (ID)** or certified copies for shareholders must be attached.

4. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

The contractor will be held liable for any expenses that may be incurred by the Frontier Hospital as a result of damage to property and injury to personnel as a result of poor quality products.

5. FIRE RISKS

The contractor shall ensure that its personnel shall, if at any time they believe that any matter constitutes a fire risk, report this immediately to the DOH/Institution and take such remedial action as may be necessary.

6. ENERGY MANAGEMENT

The Service Provider shall comply fully with the energy management strategy implemented at the relevant Institution from time to time and shall provide the Services in an energy efficient manner.

7. OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY

In this clause the term "Act" shall mean the Occupational Health & Safety Act, No. 85 of 1993, as amended from time to time, (including any act which may take its place should it be repealed during the currency of the agreement between the parties) as read with all regulations and standards promulgated in terms of the former Machinery and Occupational Act, No 6 of 1983, as amended, and all regulations & standards promulgated in terms of the Occupational Health & Safety Act from time to time;

The Service Provider:-

- acknowledges that he/she is fully aware of the terms and conditions of the Act;
- acknowledges that he is an employer in its own right with duties and responsibilities as prescribed in the Act:
- agrees to comply with all rules and regulations implemented by or on behalf of the DoH at the relevant Instituion in covering letter relating to health and safety and will inform the DoH immediately should Service Provider for any reason be unable to comply with the provisions of the Act and such rules and regulations.

8. SERVICE LEVEL AGREEMENT

It is recorded that the DoH and the service provider will enter into a Service Level Agreement stipulating exact deliverables and terms of payment. Performance measurement provisions shall be reduced to writing in a service level agreement if required and signed by both parties.

9. PERFORMANCE MEASUREMENT PROVISIONS

9.1 Introduction.

Service Provider shall provide the Services during the term of the contract in compliance with the quality and related standards stipulated in the Specifications and the service level agreement (if any) contemplated in clause 11 above.

The provisions of Clause 10 document contains the manner in which Service Provider's performance will be measured throughout the term of the contract.

- **9.2 Compliance.** For purposes of the contract the compliance by Service Provider with the stipulated responsibilities and service standards will be determined:-
 - with reference to reports provided by Service Provider;
 - with reference to reports or complaints received from third parties:
 - by means of user satisfaction surveys conducted by DoH
 - by means of service reviews, inspections or any audit carried out by or on behalf of the DoH.
- 9.3 Records. Service Provider shall at all times keep full and accurate records of all Services provided in terms of the contract and shall retain such records for the currency of the contract. Upon termination of the contract such records must be provided to the DoH upon request.

9.4 Measurement of performance

Periodic checks: DoH and/or its appointed Technical Support Manager shall carry out periodic checks (the intervals to be determined by DoH) the purpose of which shall be to determine whether Service Provider is providing the Services in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contract if accepted by DoH Frontier Hospital.

- Service complaints: All service complaints, deviations, non-conforming services and suggestions that are reported to Service Provider by DoH, its appointed facilities manager, or any other party shall be given proper and speedy consideration by Service Provider. The Service Provider shall investigate complaints, deviations and non-conforming services in accordance with procedures approved by the DoH.
- User satisfaction survey: A user satisfaction survey shall be conducted by DoH at such intervals as DoH may determine to assess service user satisfaction. The user satisfaction survey shall be conducted in such form and in accordance with such procedures as the parties may agree to in writing from time to time.
- 9.5 Results of checks, audits and surveys DoH shall be entitled to utilise the findings of the surveys, checks, audits and reports contemplated above to determine compliance by Service Provider with the service standards and responsibilities stipulated in the contract. It is recorded that the results of the above checks shall, save to the extent that Service Provider can prove otherwise be binding on Service Provider and DoH shall be entitled to exercise its remedies stipulated in the contract based on such findings.

10. BREACH AND TERMINATION

Bidders are referred to Paragraph 23 of General Conditions of Contract (GCC) relating to failure to comply with conditions of this contract.

11. LOSS AND DAMAGE

Service Provider hereby indemnifies the State, and will hold the State harmless, against any loss or damages which the State may suffer, or any claims lodged against the State by any third party arising out of or relating to any loss that the State or such third party may suffer as a result of, or arising out of any act or omission of any personnel of Service Provider or the failure of Service Provider to provide the Services in accordance with the provisions of the contract.

12. SUB-SERVICE PROVIDERS

Service Provider may only sub-contract its obligations under the contract with the prior written consent of the DoH (or any other authorized authority) and then only to a person and to the extent approved by the DoH or such authority and upon such terms and conditions as the DoH or such authority require. It is recorded that where such consent is given Service Provider shall remain liable to DoH for the performance of the Services.

TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR GARDENING SERVICES

I. Responsibilities of the service provider

- 1.1 The contractor will provide ground maintenance services and grass cutting within the areas at the Hospital, Hospital Flats and 24 Winterberg Road, in accordance with the provisions of this Specification which shall include but not limited to:
 - · Garden Services and
 - Ad-Hoc Services
- 1.2. The contractor shall provide Ground Maintenance Services during the service hours.
- 1.3. The contractor will be responsible for supply all equipment and machinery to provide the service in accordance with this specification.
- 1.4. In addition to the grounds maintenance services, the contractor shall provide all such other services as may be ancillary to or reasonably for contractor to provide the grounds maintenance services in accordance with specification.
- 1.5. The contractor shall be required to comply with various general responsibilities in the provision of grounds maintenance services. These general responsibilities shall apply to all the various services forming part of the ground maintenance services.
- 1.6. The contractor shall provide a scheduled and reactive ground maintenance service on a day to day basis in all areas of the hospital in accordance with the provisions of the specification.
- 1.7. The contractor shall ensure that routines and hospital processes in all areas are not adversely affected by ground maintenance services.
- 1.8. The contractor shall ensure safe working practices are followed in public areas, corridors and all other affected areas of the hospital, in terms of the Health and Safety Act, Act No 85 of 1933.
- 1.9. The Contractor shall ensure that its entire staff is adequately trained for the proper fulfilment of their duties in respect of Ground Maintenance Services.
- 1.10. The Contractor shall ensure that his/ her team come daily and will also be responsible for collecting papers and rubble around the hospital

1.11 Responsibilities in service hours cannot be adhered to

In the event that any of the areas are in use during the service hours the Contractor shall liaise with the Facilities Manager to agree on alternative time as during which the Grounds Maintenance Service can be provided.

1.12 STAFF

The Contractor shall employ a <u>minimum</u> of 8 employees to provide the ground maintenance services in accordance with the provision of this specification.

- 1.13 The contractor must provide its employees with full appropriate PPE for this kind of work and for any pandemic. **The following list of PPE is compulsory:**
 - Safety goggles (appropriate for grass cutting)
 - Gloves (heavy duty)
 - Safety boots
 - Dust masks
 - Work suits / overalls (Marked with company name).
 - Helmets
- 1.14 Service provider **should submit monthly work plan** to Facilities Manager before service commencement.
- 1.15 Attendance register for all company employees must be signed at all times and submitted to maintenance supervisor.

2. GARDENING SERVICES

2.1 Contractor's Responsibilities- General

Contractor shall:

- 2.1.1. Allow for the cost of establishing the aesthetically pleasing garden throughout the Hospital and hospital houses as part of his/ her contract
- 2.1.2. Once established, maintain the areas within the hospital including all trees, groundcover, scrubs, flowerbeds, planted areas, removal of weeds in paving areas and lawns within the hospital to an aesthetically acceptable condition and standard.

2.2. Maintenance of grass areas

- 2.2.1. The contractor shall:
- 2.2.1.1. Maintain the grass areas by inter alia mowing and edging such areas, by removing dead grass and by controlling weeds using weed killer that are SABS approved.
- 2.2.1.2. Ensures that all grass areas within the hospital and hospital houses will be maintained.
- 2.22. In Addition to the above, the contractor shall ensure that:
- 2.2.2.1. All level grass areas will be cut by using 2 lawn mowers
- 2.2.2.2. All smaller areas which are not accessible for the mowers will be cut by at least 10 brush cutters.
- 2.2.2.3. A crew compromising of a sufficient number of brush cutters will cut the veld grass, road verges and all embankments.
- 2.3. Maintenance and cultivation of ground cover. shrubs and other planted areas The contractor shall:

- 2.3.1 Maintain ground cover, shrubs, beds and other planted areas by inter alia removing and replacing dead plants,
- 2.3.2 Ensure that all ground cover, shrubs, beds and other area will be maintained in accordance with the service standards
- 2.3.2.1 In addition to the above the contractor shall ensure that there will be sufficient number of gardeners that will be responsible for maintaining the ground cover, shrubs, beds and other planted areas. Such gardeners shall also be responsible for the collection of the dead plants, papers, rubble, garbage and dispose accordingly.

2.4. Maintaining trees

- 2.4.1 Contractor shall
- 2.4.1.1. Ensure that all trees will be maintained by pruning when overgrown.
- 2.4.1.2 Removal and cut of unwanted trees on certain areas.

2.5. Watering

- 2.5.1. The contractor shall ensure that all trees, groundcover, shrubs, flowerbeds, and other planted areas and lawns within the Hospital are properly watered by means of hand watering
- 2.52 The contractor shall comply fully with any water restrictions, water conservation policies implemented at the Hospital.

3. Responsibilities relating to equipment

- 3.1 The Contractor shall ensure that:
- 3.1 .1. No non-compliant equipment is used by any person whatsoever in the provision of the Ground Maintenance Service
- 3.1 .2. All equipment to be used in a particular area will be used only in its designated area
- 3.1.3 All equipment used in the provision of the Ground Maintenance Services are properly cleaned and stored.
- 3.1.4. Staff is properly trained in the use of equipment and have required protective clothing.

NOTES

The purpose of this document is to:

- (i) Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to government bids, contracts and orders; and
- (ii) To ensure that clients be familiar with regard to the rights and obligations of all parties involved in doing business with government.

In this document words in the singular also mean in the plural and vice versa and words in the masculine also mean in the feminine and neuter.

- The General Conditions of Contract (GCC) will form part of all bid documents and may not be amended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid, should be compiled separately for every bid (if applicable) and will supplement the General Conditions of Contract. Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.

General Conditions of Contract

- 1. **Definitions** 1. The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:
 - 1.1 "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
 - 1.2 "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
 - 1.3 "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
 - 1.4 "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
 - 1.5 "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
 - "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
 - 1.7 "Day" means calendar day.
 - 1.8 "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
 - 1.9 "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
 - 1.10 "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
 - 1.11 "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.

- 1.12 "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable.
 - Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.
- 1.13 "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14 "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15 "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.
- "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his sub Service Providers) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17 "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18 "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19 "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20 "Project site," where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21 "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.22 "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.23 "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24 "Services" means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.
- 1.25 "Written" or "in writing" means handwritten in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.
- 2. Application 2.1 These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents.

- 2.2 Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works.
- 2.3 Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

3. General

- 3.1 Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.
- 3.2 With certain exceptions, invitations to bid are only published in the Government Tender Bulletin. The Government Tender Bulletin may be obtained directly from the Government Printer, Private Bag X85, Pretoria 0001, or accessed electronically from www.treasury.gov.za

4. Standards

4.1 The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.

5. Use of Contract documents and information;

- inspection.
- 5.1 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent. disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- 5.2 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.
- 5.3 Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause, 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- 5.4 The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

6. Patent rights

6.1 The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

7. Performance Security

7.1 Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in SCC.

- 7.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.
- 7.3 The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:
 - a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
 - (b) a cashier's or certified cheque
- 7.4 The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

8. Inspections, tests and analyses

- 8.1 All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.
- 8.2 If it is a bid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage during production or execution or on completion be subject to inspection, the premises of the bidder or Service Provider shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the Department or an organization acting on behalf of the Department.
- 8.3 If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.
- 8.4 If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the supplies to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.
 - 8.5 Where the supplies or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such supplies or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier.
 - 8.6 Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.
 - 8.7 Any contract supplies may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analyzed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected supplies shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with supplies which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected supplies shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.

8.8 The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 23 of GCC.

9. Packing

- 9.1 The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.
- 9.2 The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified in SCC, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.

10. Delivery and documents

- Delivery of the goods shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract. The details of shipping and/or other documents to be furnished by the supplier are specified in SCC.
- 10.2 Documents to be submitted by the supplier are specified in SCC.

11. Insurance

11.1 The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified in the SCC.

12. Transportation

12.1 Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified in the SCC.

13. Incidental Services

- 13.1 The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any, specified in SCC:
 - performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;
 - (b) furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods:
 - (c) furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods;

- (d) performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and
- (e) training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods.
- Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services.

14. Spare parts

- As specified in SCC, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier:
 - (a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and
 - (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
 - (i) Advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
 - (ii) following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

15. Warranty

- 15.1 The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.
- This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise in SCC.
- 15.3 The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of and claims arising under this warranty.
- Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.
- 15.5 If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s)

within the period specified in SCC, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract.

16. Payment

- 16.1 The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified in SCC.
- The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfillment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.
- 16.3 Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier.
- 16.4 Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated in SCC.

17. Prices

17.1 Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized in SCC or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.

18. Contract Amendments

18.1 No variation in or modification of the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties concerned.

19. Assignment

19.1 The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent.

20. Subcontracts

20.1 The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contracts if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.

21. Delays in the supplier's performance

- 21.1 Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.
- 21.2 If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subService Provider(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.
- 21.3 No provision in a contract shall be deemed to prohibit the obtaining of supplies or services from a national department, provincial department, or a local authority.

- 21.4 The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the supplies are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.
- 21.5 Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause
- 21.2 without the application of penalties.
- 21.6 Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without canceling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

22. Penalties

22.1 Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

23. Termination for default

- 23.1 The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:
 - (a) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchaser pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2;
 - (b) if the Supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract: or
 - (c) if the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.
- 23.2 In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.

24. Anti-dumping and countervailing duties and rights

24.1 When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or antidumping or countervailing duties are imposed, or the amount of a provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for the amount of any such increase. When, after the said date, such a provisional payment is no longer required or any such anti-dumping or countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favourable difference shall on demand be paid forthwith by the Service Provider to the State or the State may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any) which may otherwise be due to the Service Provider in regard to supplies or services which he delivered or rendered, or is to deliver or render in terms of the contract or any other contract or any other amount which may be due to him

25. Force Majeure

- 25.1 Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 22 and 23, the supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that his delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of force majeure.
- 25.2 If a force majeure situation arises, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.

26. Termination for insolvency

26.1 The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

27. Settlement of Disputes

- 27.1 If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the purchaser and the supplier in connection with or arising out of the contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.
- 27.2 If, after thirty (30) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the purchaser or the supplier may give notice to the other party of his intention to commence with mediation. No mediation in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given to the other party.
- 27.3 Should it not be possible to settle a dispute by means of mediation, it may be settled in a South African court of law.
- 27.4 Mediation proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of procedure specified in the SCC.

- 27.5 Notwithstanding any reference to mediation and/or court proceedings herein,
 - (a) the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the contract unless they otherwise agree; and
 - (b) the purchaser shall pay the supplier any monies due the supplier.
- 28.1 Except in cases of criminal negligence or willful misconduct, and in the case of infringement pursuant to Clause 6;
 - (a) the supplier shall not be liable to the purchaser, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs, provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the supplier to pay penalties and/or damages to the purchaser; and
 - (b) the aggregate liability of the supplier to the purchaser, whether under the contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total contract price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment.

29. Governing Language

29.1 The contract shall be written in English. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract that is exchanged by the parties shall also be written in English.

30. Applicable Law

30.1 The contract shall be interpreted in accordance with South African laws, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

31. Notices

- 31.1 Every written acceptance of a bid shall be posted to the supplier concerned by registered or certified mail and any other notice to him shall be posted by ordinary mail to the address furnished in his bid or to the address notified later by him in writing and such posting shall be deemed to be proper service of such notice
- The time mentioned in the contract documents for performing any act after such aforesaid notice has been given, shall be reckoned from the date of posting of such notice.

32. Taxes and Duties

- 32.1 A foreign supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside the purchaser's country.
- 32.2 A local supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted goods to the purchaser.
- 32.3 No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose tax matters are not in order. Prior to the award of a bid the Department must be in possession of a tax clearance certificate, submitted by the bidder.

This certificate must be an original issued by the South African Revenue Services.

33. National

- (d) recommend that the bidder or contractor, its shareholders and directors, or only the shareholders and directors who acted on a fraudulent basis, be restricted by the National Treasury from obtaining business from any organ of state for a period not exceeding 10 years, after the audi alteram partem (hear the other side) rule has been applied; and
- (e) forward the matter for criminal prosecution.
